I am a Professor in the Business School of Korea University in Seoul, Korea. Prior to joining the University, I had worked for the Department of Information Systems at the City University of Hong Kong. I received M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in MIS from the Graduate School of Management of the Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology (KAIST) in Seoul.

My research interests are IT Outsourcing, Knowledge management, IT-driven business model, and IT deployment and impacts on organizational performance. My research works have been published in journals, such as *MIS Quarterly*, *Information Systems Research*, *Journal of MIS*, *Journal of the AIS*, *Communications of the AIS*, *IEEE Transactions on Engineering Management*, *European Journal of Information Systems*, *Communications of the ACM*, *Information & Management*, *Decision Support System*, and others.

I am currently a Senior Editor at *Journal of the AIS* and an Area Editor at *Electronic Commerce Research and Applications*. I am also Editor-in-Chief of *Asia Pacific Journal of Information Systems*. I have served as Associate Editor for *MIS Quarterly*, *Information Systems Research*, *Communications of the AIS*, and *Information & Management*. I have worked extensively with AIS Conferences, such as the *International Conference on Information Systems (ICIS)* and *Pacific Asia Conference on Information Systems (PACIS)*, as Track Chair, Doctoral Consortium Chair, and Program Chair since 2000. I have participated actively in AIS activities. First, I have been an AIS member since 1998, and was a committee member of the AIS Finance Committee in 2009. Second, I am one of co-founders of the Korean Chapter of AIS, called KrAIS, and was an editor of the Korean webpage in the ISWorld (2003-2007). Finally, I have participated actively in AIS journals and conferences. For AIS journals, I am currently serving *Journal of the AIS* as Senior Editor (2012-present). I served *MIS Quarterly* (2008-2011) and *Information Systems Research* (2008-2010) as Associate Editor. For AIS conferences, I have attended almost every ICIS and PACIS since 1998. I have served as Program Co-Chair for PACIS (2013), Track Co-Chair for PACIS (2006, 2008, 2010), Doctoral Consortium Co-Chair of PACIS (2011), Track Co-Chair for ICIS (2010, 2011) and Program Committee for ICIS (2006, 2007, 2009, 2012).

4. Statement of platform or position (maximum of 250 words)

There are increasing number of Asian researchers, affiliates, and chapters. They make a significant contribution to the global IS research community. The role of the Asian Region in AIS will be more and more important in the future.

However, they generally work independently. In order to create a synergy effect, we should put more effort to develop diverse communication channels and collaborative activities across Asian affiliates/chapters and between Asian affiliates/chapters and industries.

If I am elected, I would like to focus on creating the synergy in the Asian Region by organizing joint workshops across different affiliates and chapters to share each other's knowledge, by creating cooperation opportunities between Asian companies and AIS chapters, and by promoting further research outlets that publish relevant topics in the Region (e.g., Pacific Asia Journal of the Association for Information Systems, Asia Pacific Journal of Information Systems, China Journal of Information Systems).

Asian scholars can benefit from having the synergy in studying IS related phenomena. Asian companies and practitioners can also benefit from advancing their perspectives of IS practices through collaboration with academia.

As a Region 3 representative, I will do my best to realize these plans, align our activities with the global community, and speak and listen on behalf of the Asian community.
